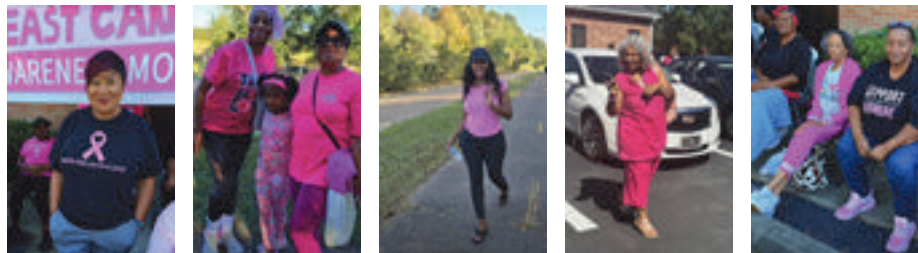
All local elected officials, business owners, churches, schools, civic and social organizations are encouraged to participate in the parade.
